DEAF and HARD-OF-HEARING SUPPORT SERVICES

Deaf & Hard of Hearing Support services at the middle school and high school are available for students who fall into any of the following categories:

- Have a documented history of hearing loss and present a need of specialized education provided by specialist of the Deaf & Hard of Hearing Support Program;
- Have specialized needs which can best be met by professionals trained to work with Deaf and Hard of Hearing students;
- Require instruction through visual languages, including but not limited to American Sign Language (ASL), Pidgin Sign Language (PSE), Signing Exact English (SEE), Cued Speech, etc.;
- Are Deaf or Hard of Hearing but may have secondary disabilities such as Vision loss, autism, intellectually disabled, CHARGE syndrome, etc.

The Deaf/Hard of Hearing (Deaf/HH) Services provide adaptive, collaborative, individualized services to meet the needs of students, teachers, and school as they relate to Deaf/HH students. Some of these services include the following:

- Hearing Strategies/Support classes small group instruction for areas as listed on the individual IEP to support the regular education curriculum;
- Replacement classes classes taught in the Deaf and Hard of Hearing Support classroom in the areas of Math, English, Social Studies, and Science following a modified regular education curriculum;

- <u>Interpreting Services</u> Developing trainings for students and staff on best practices relating to correctly using an interpreter;
- <u>Developing Language Skills</u> (Visual and spoken languages) for Deaf/HH students to aid in their daily communication and academic skills;
- In-servicing Provide one-on-one and/or group in-servicing on the specific accommodations and modifications needed to best teach Deaf/HH students:
- <u>Transition Planning</u>- Preparing the student for the post-High School world.
 This can include work experience, visiting colleges and technical schools, life skills training, etc.;
 - Other Services provided in conjunction with the LIU's Deaf/HH Support can include Speech and Language Services, Counseling Services, Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy, Work Coordinator, Special Transportation, PCA's, Interpretation of school-related activities, etc.
