
Physical Exams for 11th-grade students:

The Department of Health, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, has directed that children attending schools in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania receive a MEDICAL examination on original entry into school (Kindergarten/ First Grade) and in grades 6 and 11.

We are further directed to urge parents to have these physical examinations done by their family physician. It is felt that they will have a better knowledge of the past health history of the child and be in the best position to recommend immediate steps for any needed remedial care.

Medical exams are accepted up to one year (July 1, 2022), prior to the opening of school for the required exam that year. Completed forms should be returned to the School Nurse. Please note that students in grade 11 who participate in school sports may use one exam for both the sport physical and the state-mandated physical. In this case, the sport physical exam form should be used, and it must be dated no earlier than June 1st of the school year in which the sport will be played.

<u>Reporting to the School Nurse/ Excusal home from School:</u>

It is important to understand that it is at the nurse's discretion to excuse a student to go home. If a parent/guardian decides their student should go home, and they are not excused by the nurse, a written note/excuse blank must be filled out by the parent. This includes a student texting or calling their parents to come to pick their student up.

Medication:

All medication shall be brought to the nurse's office or the main office if the nurse is in another building, by the parent/guardian, or by another adult designated by the parent/guardian. All medication shall be stored in the original pharmacy-labeled container and kept in a locked cabinet designated for storage of medication.

Student Self-Administration of Asthma Inhalers and Epinephrine Auto-Injectors:

Before a student may possess or use an asthma inhaler or epinephrine auto-injector in the school setting, a written request from the parent/guardian that the school complies with the order of the licensed physician, certified registered nurse practitioner, or physician assistant. A written statement from the licensed physician, certified registered registered nurse practitioner, or physician assistant that states:

- Name of the drug.
- Prescribed dosage.
- Times medication is to be taken.
- Length of time medication is prescribed.
- Diagnosis or reason medication is needed unless confidential.
- Potential serious reaction or side-effects of medication.
- Emergency response.
- If the child is qualified and able to self-administer the medication.

A written acknowledgment from the school nurse that the student has demonstrated that they are capable of self-administration of the asthma inhaler and/or epinephrine autoinjector in the school setting. Determination of competency for self-administration shall be based on the student's age, cognitive function, maturity, and demonstration of responsible behavior
