

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Schedule Change Deadline Approaching

Course changes for the remainder of the year (trimesters 2 and 3) must be made by the 30th day of the first trimester (October 4th). This includes study halls as well.

No course change requests will be permitted based on teacher preference. All requests are considered on a need and space-available basis, so there are no guarantees that a request will be granted.

If a situation requires a course change after the appropriate course change window closes, the student will lose the course's credit value and receive a failing grade of a Withdrawal Fail (WF) on his or her transcript. A failing grade will be used in calculating the student's grade point average.

Absence Reporting

Administrator Approved Absences (AAA)

The school administration has established a process by which persons in parental relations may make pre-arrangements to have their child released from school for Administrator Approved Absences during the school year. In order to have these absences considered "excused," persons in parental relations submit an Administrator Approved Absence request in Skyward. Telephone requests will not be considered. Persons in parental relations who do not submit an Administrator Approved Absence request prior to the requested absence will have their child's absence considered illegal. Administrator Approved Absences are limited to ten (10) days in a school year.

The building principal shall determine if an absence is excused or illegal by applying the following guidelines:

- If the person in parental relation does not seek prior permission, the absence is unexcused unless emergency causes are given and verified
- If a student's frequency of absences from school prior to the request jeopardizes his educational progress, the absence may be denied
- If a student is failing two (2) or more core subjects, the absence may be denied
- If a student has a medical letter, the absence may be denied

No administrator approved absences for students testing on testing dates. Please reference individual building testing schedules. Testing dates may vary.

Parents\Guardians, please verify that you have completed the Agreements section in Skyward for each of your enrolled students. These are annual forms and notices that require your attention and should be acknowledged. Please review your Emergency contact information as well. Some of these forms are: Student & Guardian Handbook (Please note that this handbook is a required Skyward sign-off when completing back-to-school updates), Annual Device Agreement (If opting for coverage, please make payment via MySchoolbucks for the Device Agreement. Lunch and other activity monies are separate accounts.), Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), Athletic COC, and others.

Melcome to our new Assistant Principal



Physical Exams for 11th grade students:

The Department of Health, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, has directed that children attending schools in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania receive a MEDICAL examination on original entry into school (Kindergarten/ First Grade) and in grades 6 and 11.

We are further directed to urge parents to have these physical examinations done by their family physician. It is felt that they will have a better knowledge of the past health history of the child and be in the best position to recommend immediate steps for any needed remedial care.

Medical exams are accepted up to one year (July 1, 2022), prior to the opening of school for the required exam that year. Completed forms should be returned to the School Nurse.

Please note that students in grade 11 who participate in school sports may use one exam for both the sport physical and the state-mandated physical. In this case, the sport physical exam form should be used, and it must be dated no earlier than June 1st of the school year in which the sport will be played.

Does your child need to leave school early for an appointment? Here is what you should do:

When your child needs to leave school early, it is best to put the early dismissal into Skyward using your parent login.

Having this information entered into Skyward or ahead of time by a phone call, your child will receive a "green slip," which they show to their teacher when they are to leave. At this point, they would exit the school out the front door and meet you in the front circle. If the dismissal is 2 PM or later, the student would have to leave the school by the gym out back, and you would have to pick them up.


