Want to change a course on your schedule?

If you would like to request a course change (drop and/or add) for a first trimester class, you must do so within the first three days of the first trimester. Course changes for the remainder of the year (tris 2 and 3) must be made by the 30th day of the first trimester. This includes study halls as well. No course change requests will be permitted based on teacher preference.

All requests are considered on a need and space-available basis, so there are no guarantees that a request will be granted. Students are reminded that some AP and Honors level courses require summer work. A course change may not be possible based on missed work at this point.

If a situation requires a course change after the appropriate course change window closes, the student will lose the credit value of the course and receive a failing grade of a Withdrawal Fail (WF) on his or her transcript. A failing grade will be used in calculating the student's grade point average.

Physical Exam for Students Entering into 11th Grade

The Department of Health, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, has directed that children attending schools receive a MEDICAL examination on original entry into school (Kindergarten/ First Grade) and in grades 6 and 11.

We are further directed to urge parents to have these physical examinations done by their family physician. It is felt that they will have a better knowledge of the past health history of the child and be in the best position to recommend immediate steps for any needed remedial care.

Medical exams are accepted up to one year (July 1, 2022) prior to the opening of school for the required exam that year. Completed forms should be returned to the School Nurse.

Please note that students in grade 11 who participate in school sports may use one exam for the sport physical and the state-mandated physical. In this case, the sport physical exam form should be used, and it must be dated no earlier than June 1st of the school year in which the sport will be played.

Immunization Requirements for Students Entering into 12th Grade

In accordance with Pennsylvania's Department of Health requirements for student immunizations, we are reminding parents of students entering 12 grade of the 2nd dose of the Meningitis vaccine (MCV4)

The Pennsylvania Department of Health mandates that these immunizations be completed upon the child's entrance to the school for the 2023-2024 school year and specifies in law that we must exclude your child from attending school upon the completion of the fifth day of school if proof of immunizations is not received by that time.

Please provide the school health room with acceptable, written proof from your child's primary health care provider at your earliest convenience. A child may still obtain a medical, religious, or philosophical/strong moral or ethical conviction exemption from meeting the immunization requirements. Here is the <u>IMMUNIZATION EXEMPTION LETTER</u> Even if a child is exempt from immunizations, he or she may be excluded from school during a vaccine-preventable disease outbreak.

If you have specific questions about your child's immunization status, please contact your child's medical provider.





New Cell Phone and Earbud Rules

While this past year provided us with so much positivity, we also noticed growing problems with cell phone and earbud use during instructional class time. Many of you may have experienced teachers trying to navigate the struggles this has caused for learning and instruction. As a result of these struggles, we've recognized that we must take a step back from technology in an effort to move forward. To provide consistency across the building, we have developed the below guidelines. While this will be easy to follow for some students, it will be very difficult for other students. We ask that you preview this with your child(ren) prior to the beginning of the



23-24 school year.

Classroom Rules



- Cell phones and earbuds will not be permitted during any direct instruction time.
- Cell phones and earbuds may be permitted during self-directed work. However, if students are found to be abusing the use of cell phones and earbuds during this time, it will be considered a violation, and disciplinary steps will be followed.
- Cell phones and earbuds may be used in the hallways, during study halls, and at lunch, provided school rules are followed.



All students who have a valid driver's license and plan to drive to school and park a vehicle on campus during the 2023-2024 school year need to register and pay for a DAHS parking permit. Prior to registering for your permit, please review the school board policy (223-AR-1) regarding the use of motor vehicles on campus. It is your responsibility to abide by the expectations set forth within this policy.

You cannot use a permit from the previous year. If you intend to register for a parking permit for the 2023-2024 school year, you must fill out the Google form linked <u>here.</u> You will need to be logged into your DASD Google account in order to access this form.

Pay the \$15 parking permit fee through My School Bucks. You can find a link to pay the fee <u>here</u>. Online payment is preferred, but if necessary, cash payment may be submitted to the high school main office beginning Monday, August 21, 2023.

Once you have filled out the Google form and paid the \$15 fee, then we will secure a parking permit for you. This year we will distribute the parking permit through your homeroom teacher on the first day of school. If you have filled out the form and paid the fee prior to the first day of school (or have the check/cash payment to drop off on the morning of the first day), then you may drive to school on the first day; for all subsequent days, you must have a valid parking permit displayed in your vehicle in order to exercise the privilege of driving to and parking on campus.

Parking permits are to be displayed from the rear-view mirror and face out so they are easily visible. All students must park in the designated student parking areas where the lines are painted white. Student parking is located in the upper parking lot across from the stadium, and limited spaces on Tennis Court Hill. Driving to school and parking on campus is a privilege. Students who do not follow procedures by failing to obtain a current 2023-2024 student parking permit, failing to display the permit visibly, or parking in spaces not designated for students may receive a parking ticket from the school district or lose campus parking privileges.

Thirteen 2023 Graduates Earn the PA Seal of Biliteracy

The PA Seal of Biliteracy (PASB) recognizes students who are bilingual in English and a second language upon high school graduation; however, seniors who take AP exams don't receive their results until after graduation. Therefore, thirteen 2023 graduates are now being recognized for qualifying for the PA Seal of Biliteracy by obtaining a "4" or "5" on the AP Spanish Language and Culture Exam. The following students received a certificate and a medal for being proficient in both English and Spanish: Dallas Delogu, Ainsley Ellis, Micah Eveler, Allison Hartman, Gabriel Kolsevich, Paige Langmead, Raena Lawton, Catharine Lasher, Olivia Oppedisano, Lily Queenan, Zoe Schneider, Kayla Sebastian, and Anna Stoolmaker. With the addition of these seniors, the total number of recipients of the PASB at Dallastown High School for the 2022-2023 school year reached 26 graduates in six different languages.
